Even something meant as a joke must be taken seriously if the content is serious. Please be vigilant of your child's use of the internet, especially social media including Discord. It's a big and sometimes dangerous world out there, and we're finding again and again that unmonitored or poorly monitored internet/phone usage is setting our students up for trouble or even putting them in danger through interactions online with people whose intentions might be bad. I have shared with them how, at my last school, I had a situation with 8th graders that ultimately involved the police because of some joking that had taken place over the weekend. I have told our students here time and again to think before they text/message, and feel that reinforcement of this messaging – and monitoring of social media/internet usage from home – is important to make sure that good habits are formed. This is important for our school community, and even more, for the wellbeing and safety of our students. Thank you for your collaboration in this matter.
