Good afternoon Holy Name Families!! Can you believe the first day of school is upon us? Where did the time go? We certainly hope that you all enjoyed much deserved downtime with your families and friends and are ready for our new school year. We are very excited to get this year started.

We would like to take a moment to welcome all of the families from the Montessori School of the Angels, as well as all new incoming families. We are certain that you will love our school as much as we do.

Given that there is no gym this week (gym always starts the second week of school here at Holy Name), students should be wearing the “Summer” regular uniform. This means that girls should wear a pale yellow polo shirt or blouse, with either a navy blue skort or shorts (knee length) with knee high socks. They may also wear the jumper/skirt (depending on grade) in the HNS tartan with knee high socks or navy blue tights. Navy blue chino type pants are always an option as well. Boys should wear a pale yellow polo/oxford shirt with navy blue shorts or pants. As always PK students should wear the “HNS Gym Uniform” which is a navy blue t-shirt with navy blue jogging shorts/pants **WITH** the school emblem. Please refer to the HNS Uniform policy as there have been changes made. Gym classes will resume next week.

School begins at 8:00 a.m. with a drop off window of 7:45–8:00 a.m. If a student arrives after 8:05 a.m., they will be considered tardy. Dismissal is at 2:20 p.m. with a pick up window of 2:20 p.m.–2:30 p.m. If the student is not picked up by 2:30 p.m. they will be brought to extended daycare. If your child is in middle school and will be walking home, we will need you to write a letter stating so to keep in their file. Extended daycare bills will be sent to you the following week on Tuesday.

Lastly, PK will be using the the 850 Pearce Street entrance for pick up and dismissal. K–4 will use the Main entrance. Grade 5 will use the door nearer the playground from the parking lot, and Grades 6–8 will use the Middle School side of the 850 Pearce Street entrance.
